District 6 Event Guidelines

Contest Dates

- July 30, 2022

SCHEDULE

- Check in: 7:30 am
- Orientation: 8:30am
- Begin Shooting at 9:00am
- Awards given after all squads finish shooting and after shoot-offs to break any ties.

Entry Requirements

- Enter on 4H Online beginning June 27, 2022 at <https://v2.4honline.com/#/user/sign-in>
- Contest Fee - \$100 per contestant
- No Late Entry and No refunds.

District Deadlines

- Entry to 4HOnline by May 4, 2022

Entry Divisions (grade by August 31, 2021)

- Junior Grades 3, 4, and 5
- Intermediate Grades 6, 7, and 8
- Senior Grades 9, 10, 11 and 12

Entries Per County

- Open to the First 20 registrations for Junior participants
- Open to the First 20 registrations for Intermediate Participants
- Open to the First 20 registrations for Senior 1 (9th & 10th grade) Participants
- Open to the First 20 registrations for Senior 2 (11th & 12th grade) Participants

Range Rules

- All shooters must have signed a waiver form upon arrival to the Andrews County range.

- Transport your firearm: Unloaded, with the action open, with the muzzle pointed in a safe direction at all times.
- Only the shooters for the current round and designated Range Officials are allowed on the firing line.
- When on the firing line: No smoking, all shooters must wear eye and ear protection, keep your muzzle pointed downrange at all times.
- Load your firearm only when you are on station and only when it is your turn to shoot. For Trap and 5-Stand, you may place a shell on the carrier or in the chamber with action open, when it is the turn of the shooter immediately ahead of you.
- Absolutely no more than 2 shells loaded at a time.
- Only loads of 1-1/8 oz. or less and shot sizes 7-1/2 to 9 are allowed for any event. Texas 4-H Shooting sports rules apply to all shooting events.
- This is a live-fire range, not a playground...children must be under the supervision of an adult at all times.
- Alcohol and firearms never mix. No alcohol permitted on Andrews County 4-H shooting range property.
- If you observe anyone engaged in an unsafe activity while on our range, please do not hesitate to call out “cease fire” and immediately notify a range official. We need everyone’s help to keep everyone safe.
- Welcome spectators. We hope you enjoy watching your friends and family shoot. Please stay at least 10 yards behind all firing lines.

Special Accommodations

- Any competitor who requires auxiliary aids or special accommodations must contact the district office at least 2 weeks before the competition or note such needs when registering on 4HOnline.

Protest Guidelines

- \$50 cash and must be submitted in writing to a contest chair.
- Should be received before all shoot offs have concluded. Once the award ceremony has started no protests will be accepted.
- The Protest Committee will consist of the contest committee members and 4-H Specialist.
- The committee will meet in private to review and make judgment.
- All decisions of the committee will be final.
